Preparing a slip and fall or trip and fall case on behalf of a plaintiff is one of the more difficult kinds of personal injury cases to successfully take to trial. Robert H. Bohn, Jr. of Bohn & Fletcher, LLP will discuss the elements of and strategic approaches to these cases, the challenges of bringing a plaintiff's slip and fall or trip and fall case to trial, and how demonstrative exhibits can be used to get the preponderance of the evidence on your side.

Mr. Bohn is a Partner at Bohn & Fletcher, LLP in San Jose. His practice areas are personal injury, auto accidents, insurance bad faith, wrongful death, premises liability, product liability, etc. on the plaintiff's side. He obtained his J.D. from Santa Clara University in 1994 and is admitted to practice in California courts, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of California, the U.S. Court of Appeals 9th Circuit, the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, and the U.S. Supreme Court.

Mr. Bohn's professional activities include, among many others, being a member and past President and board member of the Santa Clara County Trial Lawyers Association. He was a 2015 finalist for the trial lawyer of the year award presented by Santa Clara County Trial Lawyers Association for a trip and fall case he tried against the State of California. In this presentation, Mr. Bohn will reference that trip and fall case and how he achieved success at trial.
